6 months since the Pylos shipwreck

BACKGROUND

On 14 June, a boat with approximately 750 refugees and migrants on board <u>sank off the coast of Pylos. Greece</u>. With only 104 survivors, the shipwreck has become one of the deadliest tragedies in the Mediterranean Sea in recent history.

In July, a delegation from Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch visited Greece to conduct research into the circumstances of the tragedy. As part of the research, the organizations spoke to survivors, relatives of the missing, NGOs, international agencies and authorities. After the visit, a joint press release was published calling for an effective, independent, and impartial investigation into the incident.

To mark 6-months since the shipwreck, Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch will host an event titled 'Together for Justice – 6 months since the Pylos shipwreck' to present the findings of joint research into the actions and omissions that contributed to the tragedy and highlight concerns regarding the current judicial investigations into the shipwreck. Legal organizations, investigative journalists and representative from the affected communities will discuss the lack of accountability for the Greek authorities' role in rights violations at borders and their growing tendency to assign heavy responsibilities to migrants and refugees as part of wider deterrence policies. 'Together for Justice – 6 months since the Pylos shipwreck' also aims to be a platform for migrants and refugees impacted by the tragedy to reclaim the narrative to share in their own words the impact that the Pylos shipwreck has had on their lives and what changes need to happen so that the rights of those who died and are unaccounted for are respected.
